**JOINT MOTION TO DISMISS THE COMPLAINT WITH PREJUDICE AND
DISCONTINUE THIS PROCEEDING**

Sanimax USA LLC (“Sanimax”) and Union Pacific Railroad Company (“Union Pacific”) submit this joint motion to dismiss the Complaint with prejudice and discontinue this proceeding. In support of their joint request, Sanimax and Union Pacific state as follows:

1. On November 6, 2020, Sanimax filed its Complaint in the above-captioned proceeding, claiming that Union Pacific’s operations at Sanimax’s South St. Paul, MN facility involved violations of 49 U.S.C. § 11101(a) (common carrier obligations), 49 U.S.C. § 11101(c) (change of common carrier terms), and 49 U.S.C. § 10702(2) (unreasonable practice). The Complaint remains pending.

2. The parties have engaged in settlement negotiations and on February 9, 2024, Sanimax and Union Pacific entered into a confidential Letter of Agreement that settles this dispute.

3. In light of these developments, the parties jointly request that the Board: (i) dismiss Sanimax’s Complaint with prejudice, with each party to bear its own costs; and (ii) discontinue this proceeding.

4. Granting this joint motion to dismiss “is consistent with the Board’s longstanding policy of encouraging the private resolution of disputes through voluntary negotiations whenever possible.” *CF Indus. Inc. v. Kaneb Pipe Line Partners, L.P.*, NOR 42084 at 2 (STB served Nov. 21, 2006).

WHEREFORE, for the reasons set forth above, Sanimax and Union Pacific jointly request that the Board dismiss the Complaint with prejudice, with each party to bear its own costs, and discontinue this proceeding.
